Licensed teachers who wish to obtain a K-12 endorsement to work with Special Education students accessing the general education curriculum and the Virginia Standards of Learning

What You'll Learn:

How You Learn:

The M.Ed. Special Education Licensure program is presented online over 32 Months. You'll take classes in 8-16 week blocks to allow intense study of each concept. Students will be required to meet with their university supervisor.
